Dear A+ Children's Academy Family,

This formal letter is for informational purposes so that you are made aware of Ohio's updated law concerning student attendance (HB96).

Regular student attendance is extremely important. Not only is it our policy that students are in school every day and on time, but it is also required by state law. Daily attendance for students is expected, and mandatory.

HB96 came into effect on September 30, 2025. Per Ohio Revised Code Section 3321.191, "Chronically Absent" is defined as missing at least 10% of the minimum number of hours required in the school year under section 3313.48 of the Revised Code for the school a student attends. Chronically Absent is being absent from school for any reason. A student is considered to be on track to reach Chronic Absenteeism at the end of the school year when they miss 2-3 days of school per month.

"Habitual Truant" is defined as a child of compulsory school age who is absent without a legitimate excuse from the public school the child is supposed to attend for 30 or more consecutive hours, 42 or more hours in one school month, or 72 or more hours in a school year. As of September 30, 2025, when a student meets the definition of habitually truant, the school or district must file a complaint in juvenile court if the student is not making satisfactory progress in improving attendance.

It is at the discretion of school administration to excuse absences without medical documentation being submitted. When your child is absent, the legal guardian should write a note to request the absence(s) be excused. The note should include the date of the request, the child's legal first and last name, the date(s) of the absence(s), and the reason why your child could not attend school. You should submit physical documentation in-person at your child's school, or you may email it to Aleisa Weber at aweber@apcacad.org.

Ohio law requires schools must communicate about attendance concerns no later than when a student has missed 5% of the minimum number of hours for any reason. This is approximately 45-50 hours (7.5-8.5 school days) total. At this point, a meeting will occur to discuss your scholar's attendance.

Approved School Dress Code

- **Khaki, navy, or black pants, shorts, skirts, or dresses**
- **Solid colored shirts with collars**
- **Solid colored sweaters and sweatshirts**
- **Closed-toed shoes**



- School dress code is mandatory. If your student is out of dress code you will receive a call to bring them clothes to change or take them home. After the third call home the student can risk being suspended.

School Vision & Hearing Screening Notification

The purpose of vision and hearing screening is to aid in the detection of school-age children who have or are at risk for developing vision/hearing disorders. These screenings are required by the Ohio Department of Health on an annual basis and will be administered during the school year to the following students:

- All new students (with no previously documented screenings)
- All students in grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7(vision only), 9 and 11
- All students with undocumented follow-up from the previous school year

Why is it important to have your child's vision and hearing screened at school?

- To identify if your child has vision problems or might be at risk for vision problems.
- Hearing is important for speech, language development, reading, and learning.
- A hearing screening can detect if your child needs further hearing testing.
- Even if your child has passed a hearing screening previously, their hearing can change.
- Hearing problems can be related to medical problems.

What tests are included in my child's vision screen?

- Observation (all grades)
- Monocular distance acuity (all grades)
- Stereopsis test (Kindergarten and First grade)
- Color deficit test (males only, in Kindergarten or First grade if not done in Kindergarten)

What tests are included in my child's hearing screen?

- Audiometry: Screening of hearing acuity

How will I find out the results of my child's vision and screening results?

- If your child passes the vision and hearing screening, you may not be contacted by the school nurse.
- If your child fails the screening, you will be informed of the test results and provided with referral paperwork.

What do I need to do if my child fails the vision or hearing screening?

- Vision and hearing screening provides a snapshot of how your child performs on the day the test was administered and is not a substitute for a complete eye exam by an optometrist/ophthalmologist or audiologist/ENT.
- Follow up should be arranged with an eye specialist (optometrist or ophthalmologist) or a hearing specialist (audiologist or ENT).
- Provide the specialist with the referral paperwork and return it to the school once it has been completed.

If you should choose opt-out of any part of the school vision and hearing screening, a written request will need to be provided to the school building's nurse or administrator. The waiver to exclude the child needs to be renewed each school year or the child's vision &/or hearing may be screened/monitored as mandated by the Ohio Department of Health guidelines for school vision & hearing screenings.
